In 2016, internet and social media in particular were decisive for the campaign and election success of President Rodrigo Duterte. In 2019 another election takes place in May: the senate election. Press- and Freedom of Expression are confronted with fake news, unlimited data production and apparently arbitrary regulation by companies. The state uses legal means specially to restrict unwanted criticism. The digitalization has an impact on social and political discourse but also on many other aspects of life (e.g. work, transport, security, education). And internet access often determines whether and how one can participate. For the Philippine Diaspora in Germany for instance, social media is an important tool to stay in touch with family and friends in the Philippines. Moreover, it often serves as the central source of information and enables the Diaspora to take part in political discourse.
